Earth Architecture

Wednesday, October 12 and Friday, October 21

Many creatures call Lynden home. Like them, we will collect objects on the grounds and then build our own fanciful habitats for Lynden's natural residents. In the studio we will follow the lead of some of nature's most notable architects—bowerbirds, beavers, ants—to make imaginative works from pond algae pulp, clay, seeds, and beeswax.

The Earth Beneath Our Feet

Artist Paul Druecke responded to the landscape at Lynden by creating *Garden Path* (2014). We will make our own site-responsive work by exploring the grounds, collecting natural materials, and forming earth vessels using local clay, found objects, and cement. Before you take these pieces of Lynden home, we'll fill them with soil and seeds from the garden.

TOURS

Lynden offers docent-led and self-guided tours for schools and other organized groups. Choose between *Art as an Avenue to EcoAwareness* and a tour that introduces the sculpture of several major 20th-century artists. Consider staying for a picnic lunch or outdoor drawing session, weather permitting.



FIELD TRIPS

Lynden's year-round field trips (K-12) and field trips for the very young (ages 3-5) focus on outdoor inquiry and hands-on learning. They address state standards in art and science, common core standards in speaking and listening, and DPI performance standards for environmental education. Field trips include *Gifts from the Trees* for ages 3-5, and *Making Spaces into Places*, *Big Changes in the Garden*, *Sculpture Construction Techniques*, and *Animals, Symbols & Sculpture* for K-12 groups.

Fo Wilson: *Eliza's Peculiar Cabinet of Curiosities*

Through October 30, 2016

Eliza's Peculiar Cabinet of Curiosities explores the interior and material worlds of an imaginary enslaved woman in an outdoor structure that is both wunderkammer and slave cabin. The cabin, on Lynden's grounds, imagines what a 19th-century woman of African descent might have collected, catalogued, and stowed in her living quarters. Researched with historical accuracy, but represented in the past, present, and future simultaneously, Eliza's collection of found and original objects, furnishings, and artifacts is animated by an Afrofuturist vision that embodies a hopeful version of an African American future. In the gallery, Wilson displays altered early 20th-century postcards in an interactive sound environment.

Pat Hidson + Tori Tasch: *Draw Print Fold Paint*

Pat Hidson and Tori Tasch shared a year-long residency at Lynden. It was the first time that Hidson, who is primarily a painter, and Tasch, who makes books and prints, had worked together, and they built their collaboration around their shared concern for the environment and a deep interest in the natural world. For this exhibition, each artist returns to her solo practice, with the occasional nod to the residency in the shape of printed seed packets and cyanotype flags. Their outdoor installation, made during the residency, remains on view.
