ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS | To be eligible for the MPS Arts Internship program, you must:

- Be at least 16 years of age at the start of work, unless the position specifically states that it is open to students 15 years of age* and older
- Be a high school equivalent student (or an out-going senior)
- Be a resident of the City of Milwaukee OR currently enrolled in a MPS high school
- Be available to work the schedule as determined by the organization and able to attend mandatory trainings/events hosted by MPS

HOW TO APPLY | To apply, send the following items directly to the organization:

- A completed MPS Arts Internship Student Application Form (this form – Part 1 and Part 2);
- A letter of interest stating why you are interested in the internship and what you have to offer the organization. (If you are applying for a second year with this program, please specify what skills or projects you would like to expand on from last year.);
- A list of 1-3 professional references, including name, relation to you, phone number and email address (references can include teachers, mentors, coaches, etc.; not family members or friends); and
- Any other information requested by the arts organization; before you apply, make sure to reach out to the organization to ask about additional application requirements.
