


## **Activity 2: Find, Look, and Point Out!**

# Vocabulary

#### Pattern:

An arrangement of shapes, lines, letters, numbers, or colors that can be repeated or used again and again. A pattern can also refer to repeating behavior of a group (see *Culture* below).

#### **Culture:**

The pattern of behavior shared by a group of people, including language, ideas, and art.

# **Tradition:**

The handing or passing down of information, beliefs, or customs from one generation to another.

## Community:

A group of people who share the same interests, or who live in the same area. Or both.

#### Continent:

On a globe, continents are the easiest things to spot. A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents. In order from largest to smallest, they are Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Australia. Most of the continents are divided into political units called countries.

### Country:

A country is land that is controlled by a single government. Countries are also called nations, states, or nation-states. Countries can be large or small. For example,

Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Russia, and the United States are large countries spread over millions of square miles.
