TOURS

Lynden offers docent-led and self-guided tours for schools and other organized groups. Choose between *Art as an Avenue to EcoAwareness* and *Sculpture: Modern and Contemporary*, a tour that introduces the sculpture of several major 20th-century artists in our collection, as well as temporary installations on the grounds. Consider staying for a picnic lunch or outdoor drawing session, weather permitting.

FIELD TRIPS

Lynden's year-round **field trips** (K-12) and **field trips for the very young** (ages 3-5) focus on outdoor inquiry and hands-on learning. They address state standards in art and science, common core standards in speaking and listening, and DPI performance standards for environmental education. Field trips include *Garden World* for ages 3-5, and *Making Spaces into Places, Big Changes in the Garden, Sculpture Construction Techniques,* and *Animals, Symbols & Sculpture* for K-12 groups. Our newest field trips, for ages 7-18, explore the imaginative and material worlds of a 19th-century woman of African descent through artist Fo Wilson's installation, *Eliza's Peculiar Cabinet of Curiosities.*

Needs-based fee subsidies and tuition waivers are available for all of our education programs.

PROJECT FEEDERWATCH

November 11, 2017-April 6, 2018

For the fourth year in a row, Lynden is a registered site for the Cornell Lab of Ornithology's Project FeederWatch, a citizen science project that combines the interests of backyard bird watchers with the needs of ornithologists who study bird populations. By making and reporting simple, standardized counts of feeder birds, FeederWatchers contribute to the scientific understanding of bird populations. Observation hours are flexible, and we provide you with binoculars, bird charts, and comfortable indoor seating. INSIDE/OUTSIDE

Katy Cowan reflected-into-themselves-into-reflected Through October 29, 2017

The latest entry in a series of occasional exhibitions entitled "Inside/Outside," *reflected-into-themselves-into-reflected* includes seven new sculptures by Katy Cowan that begin in the gallery and spill out onto Lynden's grounds, as well as a series of preparatory drawings. The exuberant forms of Cowan's painted wooden sculptures—prairie plants and landscapes will come to mind—fill the gallery, and bronzes, slipped into unexpected locations outside, provide a playful and subtle commentary on the not-quite-wild environment at Lynden.

Small Works by Sculptors in the Bradley Family Foundation Collection November 5, 2017-February 18, 2018

As winter closes in, we will fill the gallery with smaller works by the artists whose sculptures punctuate Lynden's landscape. Among the works: a recently-acquired set of five Tony Smith posters for *The Wandering Rocks*, just outside the window; a wall relief by Heinz Mack; and sculptures by Barbara Hepworth, James Rosati, and more.
