TOURS

Lynden offers docent-led and self-guided tours for schools and other organized groups: *Art as an Avenue to EcoAwareness* and *Sculpture: Modern and Contemporary*, which introduces the sculpture of several major 20th-century artists in our collection, as well as temporary installations on the grounds. Consider staying for a picnic lunch or outdoor drawing session, weather permitting.

FIELD TRIPS

Designed for grades P-12, Lynden's **field trips** focus on outdoor inquiry and experiential learning, teaching art-making skills within the framework of environmental investigation and an exploration of historical, social, and cultural contexts. Students develop an understanding of place by challenging their observational skills and discovering relationships between art, nature, self, and community. Most field trips are offered year-round and address state and national standards in various disciplines. *Eliza's Peculiar Cabinet of Curiosities*, available April through October, explores the imaginative and material worlds of a 19th-century woman of African descent through artist Folayemi Wilson's installation on the grounds.

Rosemary Ollison: *Prosperity in a Million Scraps*

Through December 8 

Rosemary Ollison has transformed each of her apartments into an artist environment, deploying layers of pattern, duct tape sculptures, curtains of woven leather, crazy quilts, and inventive drawings. At Lynden she creates an immersive environment within the former home of Harry and Peg Bradley. Spreading beyond the gallery, the artist has transformed Lynden's dining room, preparing it for an imaginary dinner party. Ollison is a 77-year-old self-taught artist and 2018 Nohl Fellow. At 16, Ollison moved to the Midwest from an Arkansas plantation, and she began making art in 1994 while healing from an abusive marriage. She collects glass, leather, bracelets, beads, bones, and jewelry from thrift shops and rummage sales and repurposes these materials into sculptural and wearable works.



 **Call & Response** is an ongoing project that gathers a community of artists who share a commitment to the radical Black imagination as a means to re-examine the past and imagine a better future.
