Lynden's art and nature camps for children aged 20 months to 15 years integrate our collection of monumental outdoor sculpture with the natural ecology of our hidden landscapes and unique habitats. Led by artists, naturalists, and art educators, the camps explore the intersection of art and nature through collaborative inquiry and hands-on artmaking, using all of Lynden's 40 acres to create a joyful, all-senses-engaged outdoor experience. Most camps conclude with an informal showing for family and friends.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

Enrollment is limited, please register early. Camps are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Cancellation

If a camp is filled to capacity, or cancelled due to low enrollment (this will be determined 14 days prior to the first day of a camp), your registration fee will be refunded in full.

Refunds

There is a \$35 administrative fee for all refunds issued up to 14 days prior to the first day of a camp. No refunds are made after that period.

Sibling/Buddy Discount

Register for a camp with a sibling or with a friend who is new to Lynden Sculpture Garden and you each receive a \$10 discount. Registrations must be submitted together; campers do not need to register for the same camp to receive the discount. You must register by phone or mail to receive the discount.

Extended Care Options

If you need to pick your child up after 4 pm, we offer extended care from 4-5:30 pm for most full-day camps. The cost is \$7 per day and pre-registration is required.

These camps are organized around themes—from pond habitats to narrating space—and introduce a range of imaginative experiences, materials, and tools. Working on projects individually and as a team, we'll be hatching and raising chickens, building rafts to float across the pond, and recording our discoveries in accordion books, prints, and sculptures. Whether we are exploring metamorphosis or the physics of flotation, digging in the vegetable garden or carving handles for our knives, our focus is on cultivating creativity and an appreciation of process.

Fields of View

5 DAYS June 11-15 | 9 am-4 pm
Ages 6-11 • \$332/\$282 members
The dynamics of the natural world ensure that Lynden's landscape is in constant flux. We can track change by exploring differences in scale, texture, shape, and form. Whether observing an ecosystem up close or hiking through Lynden's fields, viewing plants through a microscope or raising butterflies in the pollinator garden, we will seek out change and use watercolor, pressure printing, and paper pulp to interpret our discoveries.

Pond Metropolis

5 DAYS June 18-22 | 9 am-4 pm
Ages 6-11 • \$332/\$282 members
A teeming world lies just below the water's surface. Strap on waders to observe the intricate interactions in the pond and to collect specimens for our giant aquarium. Blending the observed and the imagined, we will paint, print, and sculpt a new world of fantastical creatures. A knee-deep adventure for those who like to get their feet wet.

Pond Voyage

5 DAYS July 16-20 | 9 am-4 pm
Ages 6-11 • \$332/\$282 members
For aquatic insects, understanding buoyancy, surface tension, and propulsion is key to their survival. We will adapt this knowledge as we construct floating sculptures, prototypes for the full-sized rafts that will carry us across the pond at the end of the week. Artist-in-residence **Arianne King Comer** will share her batik-dyeing skills as we adorn ourselves and the rafts with colorful bandanas and nautical flags.

Four Corners

5 DAYS August 6-10 | 9 am-4 pm
Ages 6-11 • \$332/\$282 members
Wander to the far edges of the sculpture garden to dwell in hidden landscapes and unique habitats. How do we encounter nature? What histories can you imagine for these places? What stories do they tell? Using mapmaking, movement, and collaborative projects, we'll chronicle our discoveries in Lynden's four corners.

Flower Garden:

A Camp for Very Small Children (and Their Adults)

3 DAYS June 25-27 | 9-11 am
Ages 20 months-4 years • \$96/\$85 members (one adult and one child). Additional child: \$50.
Take up residence in Lynden's flower garden and get a close look at the flowers, pollinators, and animals (real and sculptural) that live there. We will listen to stories, plant some seeds, and create our own garden hats festooned with flowers.

Hara's Home

3 DAYS July 30-August 1 | 9 am-12 pm
Ages 4-6 • \$96/\$85 members
Sculptor **Deborah Butterfield** uses driftwood to create 3D portraits of horses. We will collect our own materials in the back acres to make miniature friends and habitats for *Hara*, Lynden's Butterfield horse.

Whittlers

3 DAYS June 25-27 | 9 am-4 pm
Ages 10-15 • \$225/\$195 members
There is a unique pleasure in working natural materials with simple hand tools. We will use rasps and files to shape hardwood handles for our own fixed-blade carving knives, and then head to Lynden's back acres to select buck-thorn saplings and learn green wood carving techniques. You'll walk away with a staff, as well as a carving tool and new skills that will enable you to continue your whittling adventures at home. Returning students will add a chisel set to their tool kit, and will work on advanced carving projects.

Ages 5-7 • \$185
Immerse your child in the world of art and the French language, taught by a native French speaker. Enjoy creating art projects inspired by French songs and stories while making new friends and acquiring new concepts of the world through language. No French experience necessary, but all levels welcome.

Roots & Feet:

A Camp for Very Small Children (and Their Adults)

3 DAYS August 13-15 | 9-11 am
Ages 20 months-4 years • \$96/\$85 members (one adult and one child). Additional child: \$50.
Join your child or grandchild in an up-close, hands-on exploration of the plants, insects, and animals that share the garden with us. Each day's mini-safari will be followed by story time and art making.

Story River

3 DAYS August 13-15 | 9 am-12 pm
Ages 4-6 • \$96/\$85 members
Create an accordion picture book to record a week of discoveries at Lynden. Leaves and seeds become characters, plants provide colors, and sound maps will describe our nature walks in these experiential journals.

Symbiotic Relationships

5 DAYS July 30-August 3 | 1-4 pm
Ages 10-15 • \$142/\$121 members
Much of the activity we observe at Lynden is the result of organisms working in concert with each other. Symbiosis takes many forms, and guest artist **Melissa Courtney** draws a parallel between biology and art by asking questions about collaboration, artmaking techniques, and color theory. Focusing on printmaking and installation-building, we will explore mutualism, commensalism, and parasitism: some of the ways that artists, materials—and humans—can interact.

Writers in the Garden

5 DAYS July 9-13 | 9am-1:30 pm
Ages 10-15 • \$215/\$182 members
Aspiring writers are invited to join National Writing Project teacher leaders in a supportive writing community. With the sculpture garden as a source of inspiration, you will explore a variety of creative writing genres and engage in the entire writing process, from brainstorming and drafting, to providing and receiving feedback, revising, and editing.
