### ***Mysteries of Winter***

**Monday, January 26 & Monday, February 16**

Winter can appear to be a silent, frozen time—a call for hibernation and long naps. However, there are creatures out every day finding food, and quiet processes continue in the plants and ponds. We will track the mysteries of life in winter, using snow and ice as aids. Warming up in the studio, we'll use animal tracks in the snow at Lynden as inspiration for creating diorama sculptures that tell stories of life in winter.

### ***Tree House***

**Friday, March 6**

Imagine a tree house... then spend the day using wood, paper and clay to construct one of your own. With a focus on creative invention, we'll help you design a miniature hideaway for your imagination.

### ***Bird House***

**Friday, March 20**

Lynden provides a wonderful habitat for local and migrating birds, as well as for visiting artists. During this workshop we will explore Lynden's avian habitats and learn about the Cornell Ornithology Lab's FeederWatch program. In the studio, we'll take inspiration from the whimsical birdhouses made by French artist-in-residence Colombe Marcasiano. While these diminutive structures look like they could almost be homes for birds, they are really temporary sculptures—and that's what we'll make, too.

## TOURS

Lynden offers docent-led and self-guided tours from May through October. Choose between *Art as an Avenue to EcoAwareness* and a tour that introduces students and teachers to the sculpture of several major 20th-century artists. Consider staying for a picnic lunch or outdoor drawing session.

## FIELD TRIPS

Lynden's year-round field trips focus on outdoor inquiry and hands-on learning. They address state standards in art and science, common core standards in speaking and listening, and DPI performance standards for environmental education.

- Art field trips combine mini-tours with hands-on artmaking. Topics include *Observation, Sculpture Construction Techniques, and Animals, Symbols and Sculpture.*
- Nature field trips explore the ecology of our site in each season and conclude with an art project that reflects the day's discoveries.

## CUSTOMIZED PROGRAMS

Bring the sculpture garden to your classroom prior to a tour or field trip, or integrate your specific curricular needs into a visit to Lynden.

As our current exhibition, *Urban Wood Encounter*, draws to a close, we spend an afternoon tracing the steps from tree to table (or, in this case, foot stool), demonstrating how we can transform this overlooked resource and divert it from local waste streams. Urban wood activist Dwayne Sperber leads a tree walk and exhibition tour, and artist Joseph La Macchia offers a hands-on woodworking workshop. Working solo, with a friend, or with your kids, make a simple four-legged foot stool from local urban ash wood.

## Project FeederWatch

Lynden is a registered site for the Cornell Lab of Ornithology's **Project FeederWatch**, a citizen science project that combines the interests of backyard bird watchers with the needs of ornithologists who study bird populations. By making and reporting simple, standardized counts of feeder birds, FeederWatchers contribute to the scientific understanding of bird populations. We have designated at least two consecutive days each month for orientations and counting. Once you've received your training, you can sign up for any of the bird watching slots at Lynden. ### *Urban Wood Encounter*

**Through February 21, 2015**

*Urban Wood Encounter*, now in its fourth year, is designed to introduce the public to the environmental value of urban wood within the context of an exhibition of fine furniture. Urban wood comes from the trees that line our streets, shade our homes, and define our parks--trees that are not harvested for their timber value but instead often find their way into landfills when they succumb to age, injury or disease. In an effort to advance the sustainable recovery and the best use of the products of urban forests, Urban Wood Encounter challenges furniture makers and designers to create inspiring, thoughtful, and beautiful furniture from this regionally abundant and underutilized natural resource.



### *Robin Jebavy: Recent Paintings*

**March 1-May 31, 2015**

**Opening reception: Sunday, March 1, 3-5 pm +**

Robin Jebavy makes still life paintings of glassware. Her project, however, is much larger: to offer the viewer an experience that evokes the original, sublime, oceanic feelings of union with the strange and mysterious "other," of self with universe. Her paintings invite the viewer to part the curtain and sense oneness with the world--a state in which we found ourselves in the mother's womb before birth, and from which we all emerged. Jebavy employs glassware forms to construct altar-like architectural spaces that evoke Baroque artworks, illusionistic Italian ceiling paintings, and cathedrals. In her recent paintings, she experiments with ornate cut-glass forms to achieve a feeling of the "embroidered" interconnectedness of self and world.
