

Join us for a summer of art and nature!

Lynden's art and nature camps for children aged 20 months to 13 years integrate our collection of monumental outdoor sculpture with the natural ecology of park, pond, and woodland. Led by artists, naturalists, and art educators, the camps explore the intersection of art and nature through collaborative discovery and hands-on artmaking, using all of Lynden's 40 acres to create a joyful outdoor experience. Each camp concludes with an informal showing for family and friends.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

Enrollment is limited, please register early. Camps are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Once you register, you will receive a confirmation via email with additional information.

Cancellation: If a camp is filled to capacity, or cancelled due to low enrollment (this will be determined 14 days prior to the first day of a camp), your registration fee will be refunded in full.

Refunds: There is a \$35 administrative fee for all refunds issued up to 14 days prior to the first day of a camp. No refunds are made after that period.

Sibling/Buddy Discount: Register for a camp with a sibling or with a friend who is new to Lynden Sculpture Garden and you each receive a \$10 discount. Registrations must be submitted together; campers do not need to register for the same camp to receive the discount.

Extended Care Options: Cost is \$5 per day for either option.

- If you need to pick your child up after 4 pm, we offer extended care from 4-5:30 pm for all full-day (9 am-4 pm) camps.
- If you are registering your child for a morning camp and an afternoon camp, and would like them to stay over the lunch hour, we offer supervised lunch (bring your own) and games.

Bird House

3 DAYS June 15-17 I 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$189/\$158 members During her residency at Lynden, artist Colombe Marcasiano made a series of whimsical birdhouses and hung them in one of our trees. While these diminutive structures look like they could almost be homes for birds, they are really temporary outdoor sculptures—and that's what we'll be making (and exhibiting in trees).

Across the Pond

2 DAYS June 18-19 | 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$126/\$105 members Starting with Marta Pan's *Floating Sculpture No.3* (1971), we'll investigate how sculpture responds to the environment in which it is placed. Working in groups, we'll build sculptures that float across Lynden's small pond.

Trees, Toads and Treasures: A Camp for Very Small Children (and Their Adults)

3 DAYS June 22-24 I 9-11 am Ages 20 months-4 years. No limit on adult age! • \$80/\$67 members (one adult and one child). Additional child: \$45. Join your grandchild—or child—for hands-on nature exploration and artmaking among Lynden's trees, toads and treasures.

Garden Animals

3 DAYS June 22-24 I 1-4 pm Ages 4-6 • \$81/\$68 members Explore the role that animals play in art as we uncover Lynden's collection of animal sculpture, discover how animals are viewed in other cultures, and create sculptures of our favorite animals.

Grow Your Own

2 DAYS June 25-26 I 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$126/\$105 members Planters can be made from many things: quail eggs and corks to hold a single specimen; cement and clay formed in or around found objects for a collection. We will fill our planters with succulents and herbs for a garden you'll enjoy all summer long.

Art Elements

4 DAYS June 29-July 2 I 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$252/\$210 members Earth, fire, wind, and water: how can we interpret these elements in art and nature? With a special focus on sustainability, we will integrate scientific inquiry and artmaking, building a lifelong love of nature and the world we live in.

Spirals

2 DAYS July 6-7 I 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$126/\$105 members What do Robert Smithson's famous earthwork, choreographer Martha Graham, and sunflowers have in common? They all employ the wondrous, beautiful, functional spiral. We will scavenge the sculpture garden for natural examples and make some spirals of our own using art and movement.

Tree House

3 DAYS July 8-10 I 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$189/\$158 members Imagine a tree house...then use wood, paper and clay to construct one of your own. With a focus on creative invention, we'll help you design a miniature hideaway for your imagination.

Movement & Migration

5 DAYS July 13-17 I 9 am-12 pm Ages 6-11 • \$135/\$113 members At Lynden, birds migrate, and bodies human and animal—move across the landscape. We will explore migration through site-specific outdoor artmaking, nature activities, and movement, crossing paths with choreographer and artist-in-residence **Reggie Wilson** on the final day. Migration is a central theme in *Moses(es)*, the work he and his company will perform on July 18.

Sea & Sky

3 DAYS July 13-15 | 1-4 pm Ages 4-6 • \$81/\$68 members Fly above the sculptures and swim beneath the water lilies in a series of games, stories, and hands-on projects with clay, collage and paint.

Imaginary Creatures

5 DAYS July 20-24 I 9 am-12 pm Ages 7-11 • \$135/\$113 members Create your own world from recycled materials, scraps of metal and wood, modeling clay—and your imagination. Follow Sally Duback into the back acres to forage for interesting ingredients, then build dioramas and habitats for the elves, trolls, fairies and other new creatures you make. Finish by telling a story about your imaginary world.

Flower World

5 DAYS July 20-24 I 9 am-12 pm Ages 6-8 • \$135/\$113 members The formal garden and the natural prairie at Lynden are bursting with flowers in July. We will use all of our senses to explore this beautiful world of flowers—the shapes, colors, structures, and many visitors to them and we will create flowers of our own.

Four Corners

5 DAYS **July 20-24 l 1-4 pm Ages 6-11 • \$135/\$113 members** Travel to the far edges of the sculpture garden to discover hidden landscapes and unique habitats. Re-imagine Lynden's four corners in collaborative projects combining art, nature, and performance.

Lost Civilization

5 DAYS July 27-31 | 9am-4pm* Ages 6-11 • \$315/\$263 members

Linda Wervey Vitamvas's shoreline *Feast* suggests a story: Who used these dishes? What did they eat? Where have they gone? Using storytelling, observation, and invention, we'll imagine a lost civilization that lived here long before the sculptures arrived, and we'll reconstruct their habitats and artifacts in Lynden's back acres.

Idea to Object

5 DAYS August 3-7 I 9 am-4 pm* Ages 6-11 • \$315/\$263 members How does an artist move from an idea to a finished work of art? We'll learn about materials and techniques used by artists in the Lynden Sculpture Garden and investigate artistic processes through hands-on projects. Discover your own creative process as you unlock your ideas.

Into the Air

5 DAYS August 10-14 | 9 am-12 pm Ages 8-10 • \$135/\$113 members

There are many airborne creatures flying about Lynden: birds, dragonflies, butterflies, and bees—to name a few. We will observe how they get around in order to find ways to create our own airborne experiences and art projects.

Giant Inflatables

2 DAYS August 17-18 | 9 am-4 pm* Ages 9-13 • \$126/\$105 members Standing beneath Mark di Suvero's large, red *Lover* is not unlike looking up at a skyscraper from the sidewalk below. We will explore the sensations created by monumental sculpture by making our own large-scale inflatables—and debuting them at Lynden's annual barbecue.

Secret Garden

5 DAYS August 24-28 | 9 am-12 pm Ages 4-6 • \$135/\$113 members Collect pebbles, twigs, mosses, and feathers from Lynden's sleepy hollows

feathers from Lynden's sleepy hollows to create miniature environments for gnomes, elves, and sprites. On the final day, we'll lead our families and friends into the secret garden to discover these magical works of art.
