## TOURS

## FIELD TRIPS

Lynden's year-round field trips (K-12) and field trips for the very young (ages 3-5) focus on outdoor inquiry and hands-on learning. They address state standards in art and science, common core standards in speaking and listening, and DPI performance standards for environmental education. Field trips include *Gifts from the Trees* for ages 3-5, and *Making Spaces into Places*, *Big Changes in the Garden*, *Sculpture Construction Techniques*, and *Animals, Symbols & Sculpture* for K-12 groups.

## Pat Hidson + Tori Tasch: *Draw Print Fold Paint*

Through February 19, 2017

Pat Hidson and Tori Tasch shared a year-long residency at Lynden. It was the first time that Hidson, who is primarily a painter, and Tasch, who makes books and prints, had worked together, and they built their collaboration around their shared concern for the environment and a deep interest in the natural world. For this exhibition, each artist returns to her solo practice, with the occasional nod to the residency in the shape of printed seed packets and cyanotype flags. Their outdoor installation, made during the residency, remains on view.



## Women, Nature, Science: *Cecelia Condit*

March 4-June 25, 2017

Opening reception: March 4, 3-5 pm FREE

Cecelia Condit's work dissects the entanglements that connect self, society, and the natural world. A storyteller of psychologically-inflected contemporary fairy tales, Condit makes videos that—like the best fairy tales—oscillate between beauty and the grotesque, innocence and cruelty. Her work explores the frailty of personal identity in the face of the primordial unknown that sits just outside the frame, a charged space loaded with irony and danger. In new works that evince a growing interest in landscape, self becomes synonymous with place, enabling the artist to look at time and space in relation to landscape and our planet, to move from the insistently personal to the universal, and from fairy tale to myth. Also on view: virtuosic photographs that subvert scale and time to create fictitious micro-landscapes.
